

MAHAK - the Society to Support Children Suffering from Cancer

MAHAK – the Society to Support Children Suffering from Cancer is a charity organization established in 1991 and continues since as an independent NGO exclusively funded by benevolent citizens concerned with the welfare of children with cancer and their families. By March 2023, MAHAK operated with 867 paid staff and hundreds of volunteers scattered across Iran, providing full treatment, research, and psycho-social support to every Iranian and non-Iranian family whose child has cancer and is in need of financial and medical support. This inclusive service has been provided to over 42,751 cases by the end of March 2023 with close to 12,905 active cases receiving treatment and psycho-social support in all public hospitals throughout the country with pediatric oncology wards.



Vision Statement

MAHAK believes that parents should have no other concern than their children's recovery and also believes that with the parents present, the children can pass the treatment processes more happily, with more hope and that consequently both children and parents can change their focus from living or not, to the lives they will lead in the future.

MAHAK ensures that every child with cancer and their families receive comprehensive and integrated services across the country and provides them with up-to-date treatment services in accordance with national and International standards. By raising awareness and education, effective diagnosis occurs in the early stages and support is provided from the very first moment a diagnosis is rendered. MAHAK strives to provide the public with the latest cancer-related information, news, necessary resources and recommendations, and by expanding its cooperation with national and international research and treatment centers, MAHAK employs the most effective methods of cancer treatment, consequently decreasing the rate of pediatric cancer.

MAHAK is known as a charity organization that serves as a model for reliability, as well as for the implementation and evaluation of programs for national and international organizations alike. By all standards, MAHAK finds its place as a top-ranked organization among NGOs, not only overall, but also in every field of its numerous activities.

MAHAK is a non-profit, non-political, and non-governmental charity, dependent exclusively on public support provided in the form of funds, as well as in-kind, goods, services, and technical expertise.

Offering comprehensive services to children with cancer and their families, providing the most advanced and effective treatment services while observing the International Charter of Patients' Rights, employing up-to-date scientific advances and establishing a new research center in order to contribute to identifying the causes of childhood cancer, and its preferred methods of diagnosis, prevention, and treatment comprise the mission of this organization.

In contributing to the reduction of the pediatric cancer rate in Iran, MAHAK has adopted a novel approach by investing in raising awareness, and in prevention education. With the objective of optimally utilizing human resources capabilities, volunteers and employees work in close cooperation to make sure humanitarian objectives are met to the highest standards. Accessing the most recent technologies enables us to further develop key capabilities.

By addressing pediatric cancer in this manner, MAHAK espouses the ideal of helping fellow human beings. Transparency, appreciation, and accountability are MAHAK's most valued principles.

MAHAK, is a multi-disciplinary organization with one of the largest specialized hospitals in the Middle East and as a result of its commitments and transparency in giving comprehensive services under one roof according to international best practices, is the most trusted organization for individual and institutional benefactors who believe in the optimal utilization of scarce resources as measured by effectiveness and efficiency indices.



- One of the key features of MAHAK hospital is full integration of assessment, diagnostic, treatment, and recovery process under one roof which many international studies have shown leads to increasing the chance of recovery.
- Close cooperation between the medical team, support services specialists including social workers and psychologists, and children's parents comprise the special features of the treatment process in MAHAK hospital.
- The registration center for donating hematopoietic stem cells was inaugurated in 2017, as the result of a joint CSR project aiming to facilitate the process of stem cell transplantation as one of the updated cancer treatments
- since the inauguration of MAHAK HLA Typing bank, it has registered more than 10000 samples of HLA data so far

Treatment Path for Children with Cancer and their Families.


- · MAHAK Hospital: All treatment, psycho-social, welfare, art, music and play therapy services are provided free-of-charge.
- Other Hospitals with Pediatric Oncology Wards: All treatment services; paid through MAHAK charity. However, in three provinces in Iran including Isfahan, Khorassan and Tabriz the same support services are provided either by volunteer social workers or other NGOs empowered by MAHAK.








Volunteers; the Faithful Arms Hugging MAHAK


Total number of volunteer working hours between March 2022 - 2023 has been close to 20371 hours.

Report on the 8 stages of Société Generale de Surveillance (SGS) NGO Benchmarking

MAHAK was audited by Société Generale de Surveillance (SGS) for the first time in 2006 and received the score of 42% which was not sufficient to receive SGS certificate. But in 2007, MAHAK received the SGS certificate by receiving the score of 76%. In 2011 and 2013, MAHAK was rewarded by the 10th best score among 230 and 263 NGOs respectively. In 2016, MAHAK has impressively been ranked as the 4th best NGO with the score of 95.5 by SGS among 299 organizations. Eventually, in 2018 this charity organization received the score of 97.5 and became the 1st NGO according to the audit. This extraordinary accomplishment can only be realized if an organization is genuinely committed to adherence to international standards in order to provide its beneficiaries with the highest level of support and patient care services.

MAHAK's Childhood Cancer Awareness Campaigns

Early Diagnosis; less painful, less costly and more effective treatment

MAHAK as a pediatric cancer care center and a full member of the Union for International Cancer Control (UICC) as well as the regional board member of Childhood Cancer International (CCI) has steadfastly participated in different occasions including World Cancer Day (WCD), International Childhood Cancer Day (ICCD), and Childhood Cancer Awareness Month (CCAM) to raise awareness about pediatric cancer and its challenges among the society. These campaigns are organized in February and September respectively.

These campaigns are implemented in line with MAHAK vision statement aiming to raise awareness among society and absorb attention to the importance of early diagnosis which leads to less costly, less painful and more effective treatment.

World Cancer Day campaign (WCD)

In February, on the occasion of world cancer day and International Childhood Cancer Day, MAHAK hold an awareness campaign engaging different strata of the society. The aim of this campaign is to communicate the challenges and complexities which the patients face during their cancer treatment as well as to celebrate the progress in its many forms that enable more people to seek and receive the care they need and deserve.

In line with its more than a quarter-century of activity, MAHAK has defined its strategies concerning provision of integrated and comprehensive care as well as the equitable distribution of resources throughout the country for all children with cancer.

In 2020, by engaging educational centers, business entities and other humanitarian organizations throughout the country in its WCD and ICCD campaign, MAHAK has received UICC's World Cancer Day Spirit Award and became a member of WCD Advisory Group for the 2022 campaign per the invitation of UICC.

MAHAK's Gold September

During every-year September, on the occasion of Childhood Cancer Awareness Month (CCAM) which is remarked by International Society of Pediatric Oncologists (SIOP) and CCI, MAHAK raises awareness among the society towards the symptoms of childhood cancers as well as the importance of early diagnosis in experiencing less costly, less painful and more effective treatment for children.

In line with the Global Initiative for Childhood Cancer, MAHAK organize this campaign with the aim of increasing the survival chance and decrease treatment difficulties through spreading the word by its ever expanding family.



International Childhood Cancer Day campaign (ICCD)

Every year, on the occasion of International Childhood Cancer Day (ICCD) in February, MAHAK with the cooperation of its ever-growing family joins Childhood Cancer International (CCI) and International Society of Pediatric Oncology (SIOP) to raise awareness about childhood cancer through a campaign.

The aim of this campaign is to absorb the society's attention towards the significant role of early diagnosis which becomes a leverage for more effective cancer treatment with less cost and less pain.

Since World Cancer Day (WCD) and ICCD are two important dates in February, MAHAK has organized its awareness campaign from February 4 to February 16 to cover these two dates. During the past three years, MAHAK joined CCI-SIOP campaign with three themes of #throughourhands, #throughyourhands and #throughtheirhands by promoting it among the families of children with cancer. This campaign has been organized purely for children with cancer and their families. In this campaign, children and families provide a message of hope for their caregivers with the color they choose. By participating in this campaign, they will receive a certificate of engagement. We hope for the families under the support of MAHAK to enjoy a better experience.
